HEDIS UPDATE

New for 2019 are exclusions for certain quality measures for members with an advanced illness or frailty. The parameters are quite specific; for more information check with your Provider Specialist, or see the NCQA blog "Improving Care for Those With Advanced Illness/Frailty", posted July 2, 2018 by Cindy Pena.

For HEDIS 2019, the following nine measures exclude individuals 65 and older who have an advanced illness and frailty or who live long-term in nursing home settings. Four of these measures also exclude those age 80 and older with frailty.

- -Breast Cancer Screening.
- -Colorectal Cancer Screening.
- -Comprehensive Diabetes Care.
- -Controlling High Blood Pressure.
- -Disease-Modifying Anti-Rheumatic Drug Therapy for Rheumatoid Arthritis.
- -Osteoporosis Management in Women Who Had a Fracture.
- -Persistence of Beta-Blocker Treatment after a Heart Attack.
- -Statin Therapy for Patients with Cardiovascular Disease.
- -Statin Therapy for Patients with Diabetes.
